Look back in time: Pearl River on TV

The following article appeared in the February, 1958, edition of *The Cadet*, Pearl River College's school newspaper at the time.

The Pearl River College Orchestra and "String of Pearls" made their television debut on WDAM-TV in Hattiesburg Wednesday night, Jan. 29, 1958. The 15-minute program CAMPUS HIGHLIGHTS was under the direction of Mr. Joe Ello.

The Orchestra opened the program with the Alma Mater. Mr. David Waite, announcer for the station, introduced Mr. Ello, the Orchestra, and the Majorettes. "The String of Pearls," led by head majorette Charlotte Lott, danced as the orchestra played "S Wonderful."

Mr. Waite then interviewed Prof. Art Higmon on the technical program here at Pearl River College.

The Orchestra swung into the

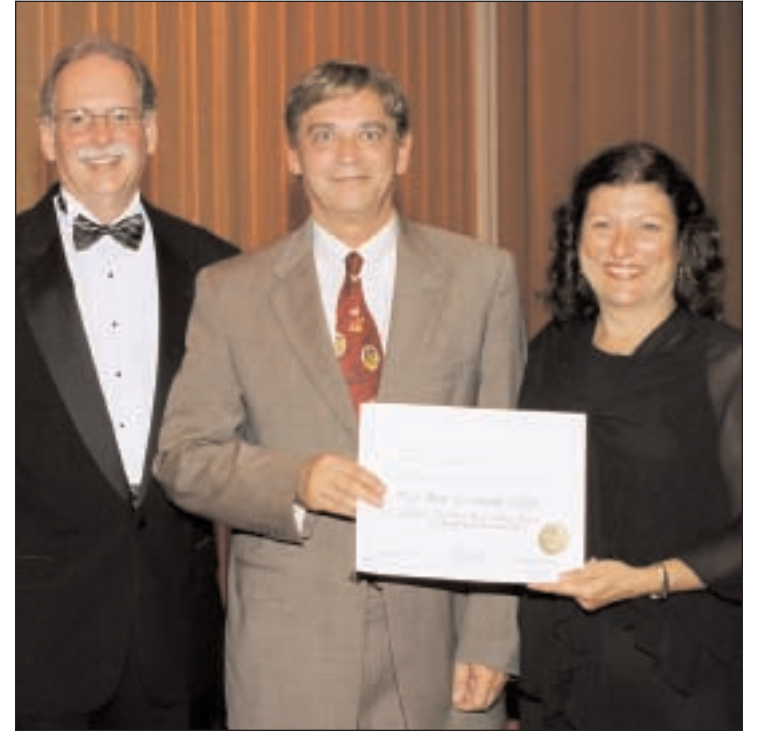
"Main Title Theme" from "The Man With The Golden Arm."
