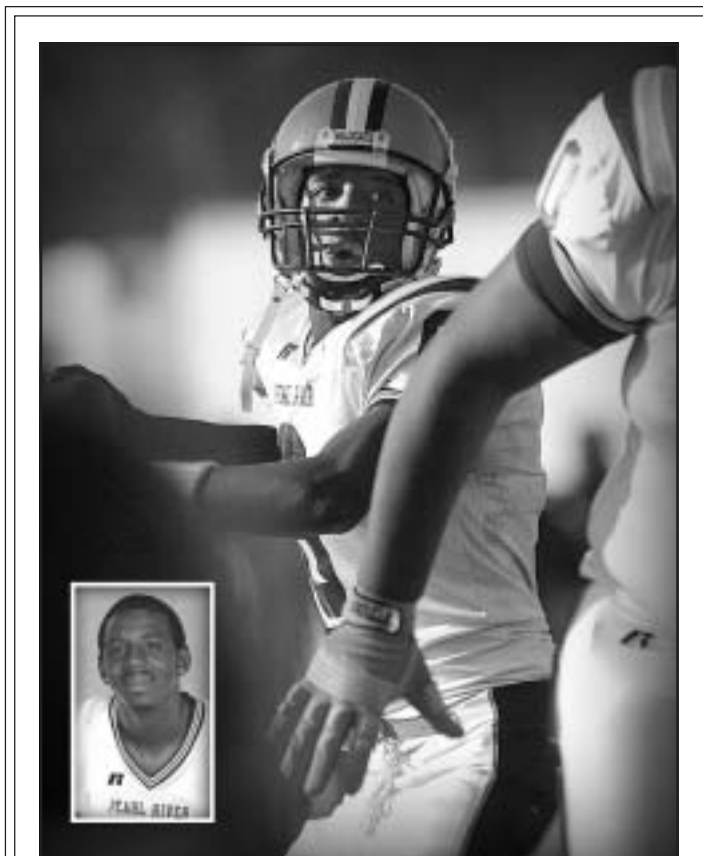

Rankin's '98 HC 'pick' a record

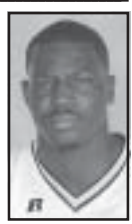

DID YOU KNOW

Wildcat All-American Reeve now graduate assistant with Rice Owls

■ RECORD-SETTING QUARTERBACK CHARLIE REEVE literally rewrote the Wildcat Record Book in 2001, as he spearheaded Coach Scott Maxfield's "air raid" passing attack that amassed a then-record 2,843 yards. Reeve, a Frisco, Tex., native; passed for a fifth-best 437 yards against Coahoma, while topping the 300-yard mark three other times during the season. In addition, his six TDs against Coahoma tied with Shane Tapper and Jimmy Oliver for the all-time record for TD passes in a game. Reeve holds the top spot in pass completions in a game with 37 versus Southwest, while his 52 pass attempts against East Central and 51 versus the Bears is second and third, respectively, to Oliver's 69 against Perkin in 2005 in the PRCC archives. Reeve earned NJCAA All-American honors, as well as All-MACJC and All-Region 23 accolades. He was also named Region 23's 'Most Valuable Player' for 2001 and signed with Southwest Texas State

(now Texas State), transferring in the spring of 2002. Soon afterwards, he was diagnosed with a congenital spinal disorder that ended his playing career. Reeve served as a student assistant coach at TSU and graduated in 2004. After a prep school assistant coaching job in Bay City, Tex., in 2004; he served as quarterbacks coach at Cuero High in Cuero, Tex., where his dad, Mark, is head coach in 2005. He is currently a graduate assistant coach at Rice University in Houston, Tex.

Franklin still on the gridiron with AFL2's Battle Wings

■ FORMER WILDCAT RICKY FRANKLIN IS STILL PASSIONATE about football. Approaching a decade since he played at PRCC, he is still dishing out hits on the gridiron with the Bossier-Shreveport Battle Wings of Arena Football League 2 after spending three years with the now-defunct Tupelo Fireants of the United Indoor Football League (UIF). Franklin headed to Delta State after his Wildcat career ended in 1997 where he helped set a standard of excellence that eventually led to an NCAA D-II national title for the Statesmen in 2000 under then-head coach Steve Campbell. Franklin pursued the NFL after his DSU tenure which saw him garner All-Gulf South Conference honors as a linebacker.
